ABOUT CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OF PHILADELPHIA

- First pediatric hospital in the United States, founded in 1855
- In 1872, CHOP gained its first resident physician
- Winter and summer playrooms and a rooftop garden were built in 1877
- 564 inpatient beds
- Employs over 16,000 people
- Performed the world's first bilateral hand transplant on a child
- Home of the Garbose Family Special Delivery Unit, the world's first delivery unit for infants with birth defects diagnosed *in utero*
